

ecoENERGY Retrofit – Homes Program

The Government of Canada's ecoENERGY Retrofit – Homes program from June 2009 to March 31, 2012 helps homeowners make their homes more energy efficient and reduce their burden of high energy costs.

Through this program, homeowners can receive a grant to help pay for energy efficiency improvements to their home. Eligible improvements include: Heating systems, Windows/doors/skylights, Water heating systems, Insulation, Air sealing, and Energy audits.

There are four steps involved for homeowners to receive a grant:

UPDATE: The federal ecoENERGY grant program is now closed to new registrations.
 For homeowners who have already received a registration number, the deadline to complete work remains March 31, 2012. For more information about these changes, visit the [Natural Resources Canada website](http://www.nrc.gc.ca).

- 1 Register with Natural Resources Canada by phone: 1-800-673-6800 (1-800-673-6800)
- 2 Conduct a post-retrofit evaluation (by a certified energy advisor) by March 31, 2012
- 3 Engage a certified energy advisor (CEA) to conduct a post-retrofit evaluation (by a certified energy advisor) by March 31, 2012
