Cost to Install Countertops



In Canada, the average cost to install countertops is \$2,400 per job for a 28 square-foot countertop, tax excluded. All figures include your new countertop plus labour and related materials, with edging (a choice of styles) and cut-outs for one sink and one faucet. Removal and disposal of your existing countertop components is available for an additional charge.

The average price of a new countertop is \$85 per square foot per job, with a range from \$23 to \$116. The exact cost to install countertops will vary according to the type of material you choose (ranging from laminate to Ultra Compact Dekton®), as well as the size and shape of your countertops plus related materials, including supply and installation of sink, faucet and backsplash, as well as the number of separate surfaces where new countertops are needed.

A Home Depot Kitchen associate will discuss the countertop surfaces, edges, backsplashes and additional options.

You will need to provide basic measurements for an initial quote, which is an estimate of the projected price of your countertop project.

The Home Depot associate will then create a measure request. Once paid for, an authorized service provider will contact you to schedule it. The term “measure” is used to describe the template, which the Authorized Service Provider creates on-site at your home.

In many cases the authorized service provider will also confirm your countertop selection including colour, edge and options. At that time, they will quote the final price of the countertop and are able to process payment on the spot (where available). This allows the project to move directly into order and production queue and secures an installation date for your project. Not ready – no problem – all measures and details will be sent to The Home Depot team to quote and call to discuss.

Add Style and Functionality with a New Kitchen Faucet

Kitchen faucets are available in a wide array of installation formats, styles and finishes, including one, two, three and four hole installations. Most Kitchen faucets also generally include an optional deck plate to accommodate use with three hole sinks.

Kitchen faucet types include:



Standard Faucet
Basic single function faucets that come with either one or two handles.



Standard with Side Spray Faucet
Basic single function faucets that come with either one or two handles, but also come with the added functionality of a side sprayer to make tasks easier.



Pullout Faucet
Pullouts are typically single handle low arc faucets that have 2 or more spray functions for increased functionality. From a design perspective, the sprayer actually pulls out from the spout for a cleaner look vs the side spray, while still being ideal for smaller spaces and minimalist design.



Pulldown Faucet
Pulldowns are high arc faucets starting at as little as 14" tall, and they typically have increased spray functions for improved functionality. The sprayer pulls down from the spout for ergonomic tasking, and while typically they are one handle designs, there are select two handle options. The benefit of a higher arc is that it provides more space in the kitchen sink, making it easier for tasking. These faucets however require greater clearance over the kitchen sink vs other types.

Specialty kitchen faucet types include:



Bar Faucet
Bar Faucets typically are smaller scale standard or pulldown faucets, typically used on smaller sinks for basic tasks.



Electronic Faucet
Electronic Faucets come in both touch and touchless models and can be either AC powered or battery operated. These faucets are typically pulldown designs, and offer the benefit of less contact and easy on and off access with the simple wave of a hand or tap of the hand, arm etc. When your hands are full or dirty, this feature is a great addition!

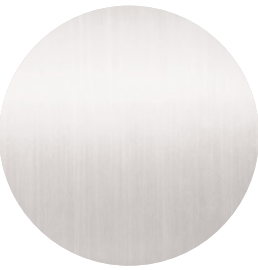


Pot Filler
Pot fillers are cold water speciality faucets that come as either deck or wall mounted and are installed at the stove. The purpose of these faucets is for easy filling of pots that otherwise would be heavy or hard to carry from the kitchen sink. This is a great addition for those who love to cook!



Drinking Water Faucet
These small scale high arc water dispensers can be additional faucets on your sink. They are to be deck mounted on your kitchen sink with a filter underneath the deck, and they provide clean and drinkable water straight from the faucet.

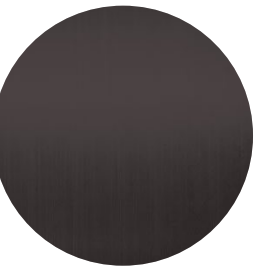

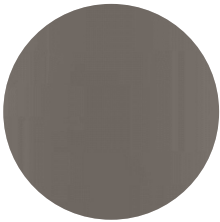

Refrigerators

Refrigerators play a central role in every kitchen. They come in either standard- or counter-depth sizes to match any kitchen design.

Fridge Types Include:

French Door Fridges

The freezer is on the bottom and the fresh food section can be easily accessed via the top twin doors. You can open a single door to keep more cold air in, or open both to have full access. The width is usually between 30 and 36 inches.

Bottom Freezer Fridges

The freezer is located below the refrigerator, making food in the refrigerator easier to reach without bending over. Bottom freezer units usually come in 22 to 33-inch widths.

Top Freezer Fridges

The classic design, it has the freezer located above the refrigerator, providing a spacious fridge interior and easy access to all items. Top freezer units usually come in 22 to 33-inch widths.

Side by Side Fridges

Wall ovens are designed to provide an excellent fit in any kitchen, no matter the layout or space restrictions. Paired with a sophisticated cooktop they can provide a stylish, modern look for your kitchen. They come in single, double, and even a combination with microwave configurations, ranging in width from 24 to 30 inches.

Range and Wall Oven Features:

Smart/Wi-Fi

Monitor and control your oven remotely using smartphone apps or home voice assistants.

True Convection Cooking

Cook food faster with the addition of a third element plus a fan that distributes hot air evenly over, under and around the dish.

Hidden Bake Element

Cleaning your oven can be difficult, so look for one with a hidden bake element, which makes the bottom of the oven easier to wipe down.



Dishwashers

The most common dishwasher is the built-in style, which fits directly under your kitchen counter. The most common dishwasher size is 24” wide, while 18” units are also available for smaller spaces. Most dishwashers come in a host of configurations with great convenience options including easy access front controls, functional towel bar handles, low-noise options, steam cycles and more.

Types of Dishwashers Include:

Built-In Dishwashers

Built-in models fit neatly under your countertop and are the most common installation type, fitting into a 24” space. They are also available in 18” compact units, perfect for small households, apartment kitchens or as a convenient addition to an in-home wet bar.

Portable Dishwashers

If a built-in model is not possible consider a portable unit that can be stored out of the way when not in use and rolled over to connect with your kitchen faucet for quick operation when needed.

Additional Dishwasher Features Include:

Adjustable dishwasher features include adjustable racking, a third rack for cutlery and awkward items, ultra quiet performance and heated dry. There are also additional cycles including half load and quick wash, and built-in hard food disposers to help eliminate pre-rinsing.



Over the Range Microwave or Range Hood

Over the Range Microwaves

OTR Microwaves provide effective cooking, defrosting and heating capabilities, with adequate venting options. Some models even include convection baking options. However, even the best venting microwaves aren’t as effective at dispersing fumes and steam as a range hood.

Range Hoods

Range hoods come in various styles depending on where it is being placed in the kitchen. A vented or ducted range hood sends the moisture and air outside of your home through the wall or roof. An unvented range hood filters the air and recirculates it back through your kitchen.

Different styles of range hoods include island hoods that float over your kitchen island and vent through the ceiling, chimney hoods that mount between cabinets, and under-cabinet hoods that mount above your cooktop but under your cabinets.

Look for specific features that fit your needs like fan speed, thermostat control, exhaust timers and more.

Your kitchen backsplash is a personality piece. The material you choose to accent wall space between countertops, cabinets and appliances can showcase the design of your kitchen – whether modern or classic. Consider your budget, space size and material you’d like to use.

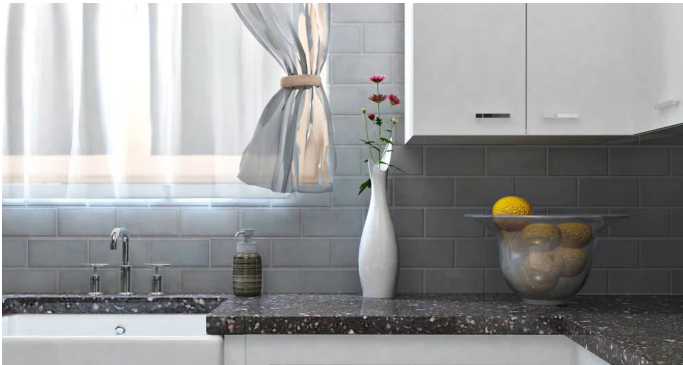
Glass

Cabinet Hardware

Complement your cabinets’ architectural style with hardware made of metal, ceramic, crystal and even plastic.

For example, simple cabinetry designs like Shaker work well with brass with practical, unadorned designs while contemporary styles can be enhanced with sleek horizontal pulls and handles in stainless steel or brushed chrome.

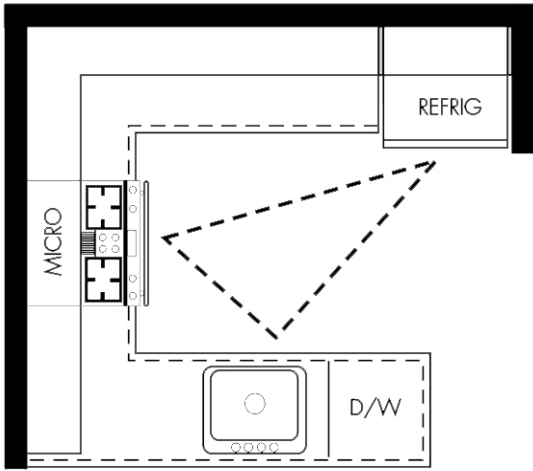
When selecting your pulls, keep in mind that no matter how exotic the material or design, they should first and foremost be easy to grasp and use.

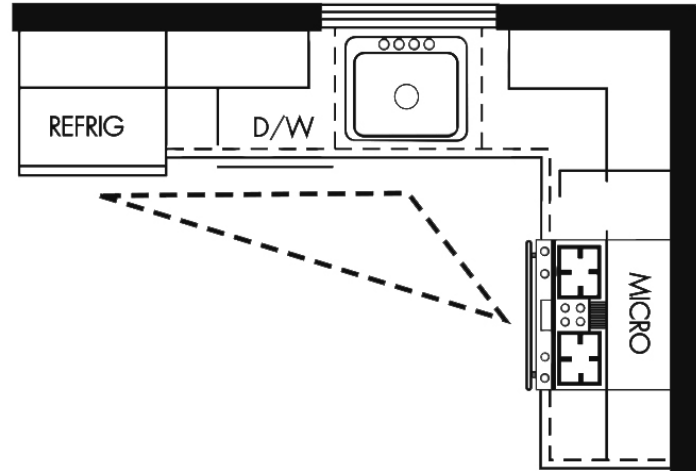
Before finalizing your kitchen design, be sure to consider this triangle and make sure you’ve got enough room to work comfortably.

U-Shaped with Peninsula



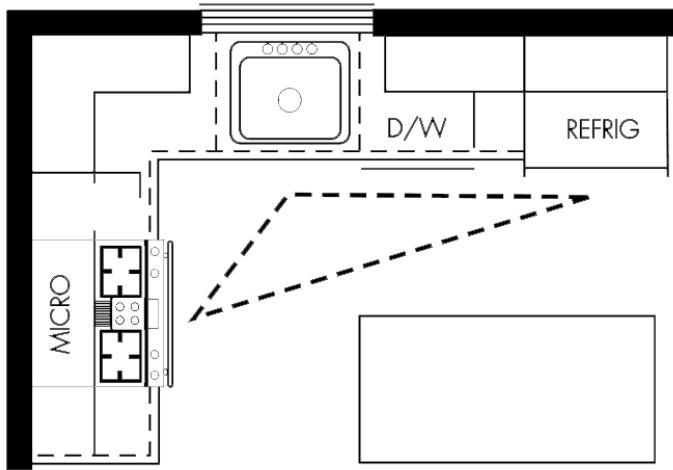
This design adds a wall of cabinets and appliances on a partial wall. To keep from feeling closed in, consider opening up one or two of the cabinet sections to adjacent spaces - for example, with a window through to the dining room.

L-Shaped



The L-shape has an advantage over the U-shape in the form of more generous workspace. With work centres on two adjacent walls, people can come in and out without entering the work area.

L-Shaped with Island



An island will dramatically increase food preparation area and cabinet space. Adding stools along one side can also create a handy casual eating area and gathering place.

How to Measure Your Space

A successful design depends on accurate measurements. Here are some tips for getting them right.

Tip:

Start with a 25-foot tape measure, a pad, pencil, eraser and stepladder. Record measurements in inches to avoid confusion later. Add wall dimensions of opposite walls – they should be equal. Measure ceiling-to-floor dimensions in at least three places in the room as many rooms are not symmetrical. Sketch each wall, and label walls, doorways and windows.

1. Measuring Doorways

Start in the left corner of any wall with a door. Measure from the corner to the left edge of the door trim. Measure the door’s width, including trim. Measure the location of other doors on the same wall in relation to the left corner of the wall.

2. Locating Windows

Start in the left corner of any wall with a window. Measure from the corner to the left edge of the window trim. Measure from the floor to the bottom edge of the trim. Measure the height and width of the window, including trim.

3. Outlets, Switches, Pipes and Vents

Start in the left corner of any wall with an outlet in it. Measure from the corner to the centre of the cover plate, then from the floor to the centre of the plate. Measure switches, pipes, vents, gas lines and water lines the same way.

4. Measuring Walls

Stand facing the sink. Let’s call the wall on your left Wall 1. The wall you’re facing is Wall 2, Wall 3 is on your right and Wall 4 is behind you. Measure along the floor to get exact measurements of each wall. Measure again at waist height and ceiling height. If there’s a soffit (a boxed-in area between the top of the cabinets and the ceiling) measure between it and the floor, and the soffit’s depth and height.



Once you’ve completed your measurements, do a rough layout of your current space, choose your options and accessories, including internal cabinet storage, decorative details and accessories.



Then, do a rough sketch of your kitchen, add the measurements and use it to work with your Home Depot Kitchen Designer. Based on your measurements we can estimate the cost of your project and help make it a reality.
